Estimating

Put a group of twenty items into a bowl, for example, Lego/stones or pasta and take a handful.

Take a quick look and estimate how many you think you have picked up. Write your estimate down and then count to check the exact number

Repeat, writing both numbers down as you go.



Zap zero

Arrange 20 toys so they are sitting in a circle.

Choose two numbers or roll two dice and add them together.

Write your numbers down. Start with addition and move to subtraction if you wish.

Remember to subtract the smaller number from the larger number.

The online dice is good for this. You can select to use 2 or 3 dice if you want a challenge.
