<p>Hunt around your home, looking for items that start with each letter of the alphabet. eg: an apple starts with the letter A. In your journal, draw a picture of each item and write the letter that it starts with.</p>	<p>Choose one room in your home. Write down 10 items that appear in that room. Cut out each word. Arrange the words in alphabetical order. When you are done, write the words in order in your journal.</p>	<p>On the footpath, draw 4 'jumping' circles in a row using a piece of chalk or a rock. Have a family member say a 4-letter word. Jump into one circle per sound, saying the letter(s) that makes each sound.</p>	<p>In your journal, write a story about finding a wild animal. Explain how you found it and what you did with it. Draw a picture to go with your story. Afterwards, read it to a family member.</p>
<p>Make up 5 new flavours of ice cream using alliteration, e.g. Chocolate Chewy Caramel Crunch. Draw a picture of each flavour. Have your family members vote for their favourite flavour!</p>	<p>In your journal, draw a self-portrait while looking in a mirror. Then, around your image, write 12 adjectives that describe you. They can be a physical description or adjectives that describe your inner self</p>	<p>Choose 6 items in your home. Write them in your journal. How many words can you rhyme with each one? See if you can think of at least 5 words for each. Was there one word that was easier to rhyme than the rest?</p>	<p>Go for a book hunt in your home. In your best handwriting, make a list in your journal of 10 books that you find. Include the title, author and illustrator for each book. Circle your favourite one in the list.</p>
<p>Have a family member call out ten 2-digit numbers. Write them down in your journal. Draw the place value for each one. Then, put the numbers in order from least to greatest.</p>	<p>Make a tally chart showing the different colours of shoes in your home. Use this information to make a bar graph. Be sure to label your graph. Write a question for a family member to answer.</p>	<p>Head outside. Lie down on the footpath. Have a family member outline your body using a piece of chalk or a rock. Stand up. Measure the outline with your shoe and then your family member's shoe. What conclusions can you make as a result?</p>	<p>With a family member's help, make a hundreds chart outside using a piece of chalk or a rock. Throw a small rock onto a number. Say the number that is 1 more, 1 less, 10 more and 10 less than that number.</p>
<p>Create a large tic-tac-toe board on the floor using coloured tape. Choose random objects around your home to use as game pieces. Play a game or two with a family member.</p>	<p>On a piece of paper, make a family calendar for the current month. Ask each family member for important dates to include on the calendar. Hang it in a location where everyone can see</p>	<p>Have a family member make an obstacle course inside or outside of your home. How fast can you get through the course? Try it again and see if you can beat your time!</p>	<p>Lie down with the bottom of your socked feet touching the wall. Slide your feet up the wall and use them to draw 2D shapes. How many shapes can you draw before putting them down?</p>
