What is the role of the Class Parents?

The purpose of the Class Parent is to help foster good communication in the school and to assist in the development of the school community.

Each class from Kindergarten to Year 6 will have at least one Class Parent, but it is recommended that there are two Class Parents. Working in pairs can be less daunting especially for new parents into the school community.

Class parents;

- Act as a liaison between the parents and your Teacher, School, P&C and Class Parent co-ordinators
- Attend when possible Class Parent meetings held once a term on the first Friday after the P&C meeting
- Collate and maintain up-to-date class contact lists
- Send emails when required to your class from the teacher, P&C or school

- Coordinate (with your teacher) your class end of year party
- With the help of the other Class Parents in your year co-ordinate the event allocated to your year
- Optional: organise social events for your class

In 2019 the events have been allocated as follows:

Kindy - morning tea during orientation (term 4) and the welcome morning tea for new kindy parents (term 1 2020).

Y1 & Y2 - Grandparents/Open Day morning tea in term 3

Y3 – Father's Day stall or breakfast (term 3)

Y4 - Mother's Day stall (term 2)

Y5 - Year 6 farewell and 2020 jersey (all year, particularly terms 3 & 4)

Y6 - Mini Fete and Year books (all year, particularly terms 3 & 4)

The class parents are also responsible for coordinating their year's involvement in our Election Day fundraising. The primary school will coordinate the stalls for the State Election on 23rd March and the infant's school will coordinate the federal election.

Please note that class parents are the coordinators of these events. They do not have to do all the work themselves!

The class parent co-ordinator, currently Gill Allen, will assist you wherever possible and there is a wealth of information and support available from parents who have organised these events previously.

Getting On Track In Time (Got It!) is an early intervention program being introduced to public primary schools across NSW. It focusses on equipping teachers and parents with the skills to support children showing some difficulty with behaviour or emotion regulation. *Got It!* aims to identify potential difficulties in behaviour, emotion and/or social skills early in a child's development, and "catch" them while they are small and more easily addressed.

The *Got It!* team engages with participating schools over 3-4 terms, with two streams of intervention, a *Universal Whole-of-School* component and a *Targeted Early Intervention* component.

Universal Whole-of-School Program - Professional development is offered to all K-6 teachers within participating schools focussing on better management of emotional and behavioural difficulties in the classroom and playground. Additionally, information is offered to all interested K-6 parents through information seminars conducted at school, and provided in school newsletters in Term 1, 2019. The parent information sessions will be held on Wednesday 13th and 27th February from 6.30-8.00pm.

Early Intervention Program – In Term 4, 2018 teachers and parents completed questionnaires for all children in K-1, in order to identify students who may benefit from *Got It!* early intervention. Children have been selected to attend a small-group program with an adult family member during Term 1, 2019.

The program is delivered by a multidisciplinary team of experienced mental health clinicians from NSW Health in partnership with NSW Education. This means that the *Got It!* team works together with education staff, children, and parents to intervene early and help children to develop in a happy and successful way.

The NSLHD *Got It!* Team has been in action for over two years and has worked in numerous schools across the district including: St Ives, Brookvale, Allambie Heights, North Ryde, West Pymble, Lane Cove West, Manly West, Thornleigh West, North Sydney Demonstration, St Ives Park, Terrey Hills, Newport, and St Ives North Public Schools. In 2019 we will be delivering our program at Turramurra, Elanora Heights, Narrabeen Lakes, Galston, and Mowbray Public Schools.

The *Got It!* program is modelled from the *Schools: Early Action* program in Victoria, and was introduced with great success in other health districts in NSW. The *Got It!* Program has now rolled out across all NSW Health Districts.



An important person in a child's school life is the School Crossing Supervisor, who ensures they cross the road safely. The role requires minimal hours out of your day and gives something worthwhile back to the community.

The hours are usually 8:00am to 9:30am and/or 2:30pm to 4:00pm Monday to Friday during school terms. You may be required to work morning, afternoon, both shifts and no shifts. As a casual you will be filling in for existing part-time staff and on call basis as required. The base rate is \$23.02 - \$27.62 per hour.

All the qualifications you need are community spirit, good communication skills, an alert and professional attitude to work and a reliable personality. The casual hours and school holidays would suit a parent or grandparent, a retiree or anyone wanting meaningful work — but not full-time.

Training for your key responsibilities of directing traffic to stop at the designated crossing and giving clear instructions to infants and primary school students to cross the road safely, will be provided. You may be required to attend a health assessment. Appointment is subject to a Working with Children Check clearance.
