Dear Parents and Carers,

Yesterday we welcomed our 20 Chinese student visitors and their teachers to the school. The children appear a little shy for now but our students are making them feel very welcome. The weather today comes as a shock to them as they have left Winter to our Summer so our air- conditioned rooms have been a relief to them. I will be taking them to Bobbin Head on Thursday as a special day out to see our National Park.

"Meet the Teacher Evening" is next week. Wednesday evening Year K-2 from 5:30-6pm Specialist Teachers in the Library from 6:15-7pm and Year 3-6 from 7-30pm. Meet the teachers in their classrooms and the specialist teachers in the Library. Positive Behaviour for Learning

Over the next few weeks I will be reminding all of our PBL expectations. It will also be an introduction to any new families to TPS.

Positive Behaviour for Learning is an evidence-based whole school process to improve learning outcomes for all students. PBL is also a process that supports school leadership teams to create positive learning environments that enable student learning and wellbeing. Successful implementation of PBL is underpinned by the support and commitment of the whole school community.

You would have all seen the many posters and signs around our school promoting our school expectations. In each of the classrooms teachers have negotiated classroom expectations with the students.

Our school expectations RESPECT, RESPONSIBILITY and PERSONAL BEST were agreed upon by the PBL Team. The staff engaged in training and in the creating of lessons to teach and model these expectations to our students.

The lessons were created to be appropriate for each year group and are retaught throughout the year. This week I have included our Playground Expectations for you to be familiar with. When students do not follow these expectations they are issued with a Pink Slip. The data we collect from these Pink Slips helps the staff determine which expectation/s need to be retaught. Students are continuously rewarded with POWs for following the expectations, which are put towards achieving Bronze Awards and ultimately a School Medal.

OOSH News

Dear Parents,

Welcome back to OOSH, Term 1 - 2019. It is so great to see our familiar faces and to welcome all of the new families.

Can we please remember the following;

OOSH is currently at full capacity and we are trying to work through our waitlist as quickly as possible. Unfortunately this means that we have **NO CASUAL SPOTS** at OOSH. Should you request a casual visit this needs to be done in writing and should parents advise us they will be absent, then we can offer the spot out. Please do not turn up on the morning or send your child to OOSH in the afternoon without having confirmation. This being said if

parents could please notify OOSH as early as possible of an absence this will allow us to be able to help out other families by giving them a casual spot.

We appreciate your patience with the new sign in/sign out system. OOSH has tried very hard to make this as easy and efficient as possible for all families. It is a new process for us and it is a legal requirement that OOSH has manual sign in and out times.

Parents will need to remember their pin to sign in and out of each session

ALL AUTHORISED PERSONS have their own individual pin to sign in or out children.

Any additional contacts (new pickup person) NEED TO BE ADDED online prior and approved by the centre to gain access to a pin.

All new authorised persons collecting will need to provide ID to the co-ordinator whilst collecting.

Please don't allow your children to sign in or out as this is a breach of regulations. ONLY PARENTS/ AUTHORISED PICKUP PERSONS are allowed to sign in or out.

Children cannot be signed out until they have been signed out. This means that if you are collecting your child at 3:05pm you will need to wait until they have physically been to the centre and signed in before you can sign out otherwise they will be marked as absent.

OOSH closes at 6:15pm. Please ensure that if you are running late that you ring up and advise the centre. Please remember that OOSH late fees are \$25 per child per 15 minutes.

Breakfast club finishes at 7:45am. Please ensure that your children are at OOSH before the end of breakfast so that the staff have time to pack away and move onto the next activities for the morning.

Tips for ALL Band Members

Please drop off your instruments to the band room in the morning and collect them at the end of the day. Do not take your instrument to your classroom, they will be safe and secure in the band storeroom and won't be a trip hazard! Don't forget to collect your instruments at the end of the day and they **must not** be left in the storeroom over the weekend.

All band students use the band storeroom, so please treat all instruments and other people's belonging with care and respect. There is lots of storage space, but it needs to be used sensibly with appropriate sized instruments placed into correct shelves and NOT left randomly on the floor!

Band parents should meet with their children's tutors and make sure they work out the best line of communication. Some tutors are very busy and some prefer emails or texts, while others have a practice book for each student and only communicate with parents in writing, or face to face during lessons. It's not always easy starting a new tutoring relationship and it may take students a few weeks to feel comfortable so if possible, parents are encouraged to attend tutorials and sit in for at least the first few weeks.

“Kiss and Drop”

In the interests of student safety and to ensure the smooth passage of vehicles at Satterley Avenue “Kiss and Drop”, the following procedures should be observed:

- DO NOT PARK IN THE KISS AND DROP ZONE between 2.30 and 4.00p.m

- **UNDER NO CIRCUMSTANCES CALL YOUR CHILD TO COME TO YOUR CAR ON THE OTHER SIDE OF THE STREET.**
- If the queue extends past the intersection of Satterley Avenue and Nimbrin Street, in fairness to other drivers, please join the queue in Nimbrin St.
- **DO NOT QUEUE ONTO THE COMMENARRA** - this is a NO STOPPING ZONE.
- K-2 students are dismissed at 3.05 p.m. Please be prompt to pick up your children.
- If you have not arrived by 3.20 p.m. students will be supervised in the K-2 Office area.
- **PLEASE DO NOT PARK ACROSS OUR NEIGHBOURS’ DRIVEWAYS.**

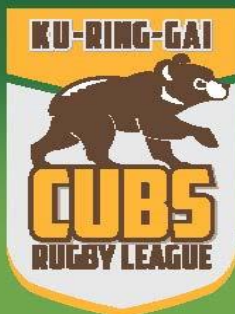

It's good for parents to answer the same questions to model reflection for your children.

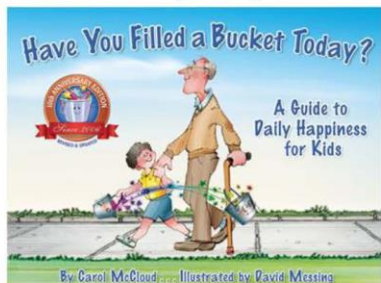
Have a regular family discussion

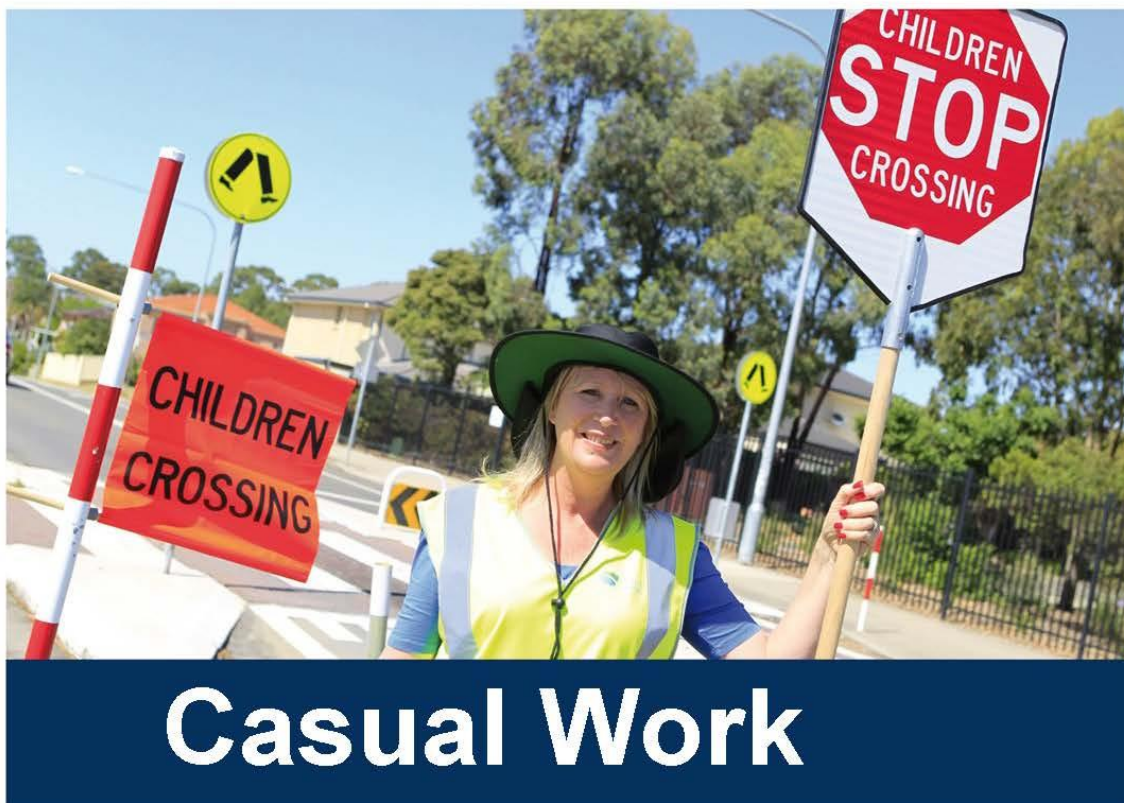

School Crossing Supervisors – Work with your community

An important person in a child's school life is the School Crossing Supervisor, who ensures they cross the road safely. The role requires minimal hours out of your day and gives something worthwhile back to the community.

The hours are usually 8:00am to 9:30am and/or 2:30pm to 4:00pm Monday to Friday during school terms. You may be required to work morning, afternoon, both shifts and no shifts. As a casual you will be filling in for existing part-time staff and on call basis as required. The base rate is \$23.02 - \$27.62 per hour.

All the qualifications you need are community spirit, good communication skills, an alert and professional attitude to work and a reliable personality. The casual hours and school holidays would suit a parent or grandparent, a retiree or anyone wanting meaningful work — but not full-time.

Training for your key responsibilities of directing traffic to stop at the designated crossing and giving clear instructions to infants and primary school students to cross the road safely, will be provided. You may be required to attend a health assessment. Appointment is subject to a Working with Children Check clearance.
