



Secondary Teacher Rugby Coaching Workshop

The DoE School Sport Unit in partnership with Australian Rugby Union (ARU) and NSW Rugby is offering the following rugby coaching accreditation workshops for K-12 teachers in NSW.

School Sport Unit - Secondary Teacher Rugby Coach L1 Accreditation

Teachers of Year 7 to Year 12 students will participate in an eleven-hour program that includes face-to-face and eLearning modules.

To gain Level 1 accreditation, all components of the course must be completed, including an on-line exam with a 90% pass mark (to be completed following attendance at the face to face workshop.)

The aim of this course is to provide the secondary school rugby coach with an understanding of the game, rugby laws and trends; coaching in practice and coaching the technical elements of the game.

The department's School Sport Unit will provide relief costs for one teacher per DoE school per workshop for Terms 1 and 2 in 2019.
