Dear Parents and Carers

Please be aware that the COVID restrictions for parents onsite have not eased and they look to remain in place for some time yet. If you need to visit the School you must enter via the Office and sign in. We are required to keep a record of all visitors no matter how short your visit. It is preferable to speak to your teacher via a phone call if at all possible. Teachers will remain on duty at the gates into Term 3. We will let you know when this changes. This also means that we continue to ask that you keep your children home if they are unwell. I know at times this is difficult but we do not want to have to close the School if we have an outbreak. Teachers will request that you collect children who present with runny noses and cold symptoms even if they are mild. We are aware there are some children who are asthmatic or suffer with with sinus issues, please let your teacher know so they are aware and we will accommodate.

Sadly we farewell Mrs Angela Pak (School Counsellor) this week. She has been a wonderful and very valued member of our School Team. She will be moving to another location. Thursdays. There will be a comprehensive handover for students continuing with our counselling service. The Learning and Support Team is also here to support this transition.

It has come to my attention that parents are collecting their children when leaving early from the K-2 classrooms. The correct process is to email the Office and we will ensure the child is at the top Office ready for collection. The leave early form will be completed and filed by the Office. If you are collecting sick children they will be sent to the top Office for collection as we have always done. This is to try to limit parents on-site as much as we can. Please be diligent with all visits to School and only access when absolutely necessary.

Our teachers are working with Mrs Harrisson to deliver assistance with Multi-lit next Term. These students have had additional help from our support casuals this Term. The extra help is of great benefit to assist with reading.

Next Term the Canteen will open for over the counter sales at recess and lunch. There will be limited products but we hope this will be another small step to normality.

Code Camp is back next Term on Wednesdays as are Art classes on Mondays. Please make sure you have enrolled if you wish to attend. Please be very diligent with social distancing when collecting from these classes. Code Camp instructors will drop to OOSH and the front gate. Art classes can be collected by walking down the driveway near the Office and waiting outside. Do not enter the rooms at any time. The Teacher will send the children out to you.
