WARM UP ROOM

Mr Rowland will take each band to their allocated warm up room. As this is one of the usual teaching rooms, please respect the items of the children who use that classroom. Please leave the room promptly after your performance. **NO FOOD IS ALLOWED IN WARM UP ROOMS.**

INSTRUMENT DROP OFF ZONE

An instrument drop-off zone is available for large instruments. Please go to Badajoz Road's carpark entrance where a parking monitor will give you access to the car park to deliver your instruments. Ryde East PS can mind instruments until your warm up room is available at the registration desk. A receipt will be given for all instruments and will be required for collection.


