The next Band Committee meeting will be on **Thursday 27 June, at 7pm** in the Staffroom. All are welcome.

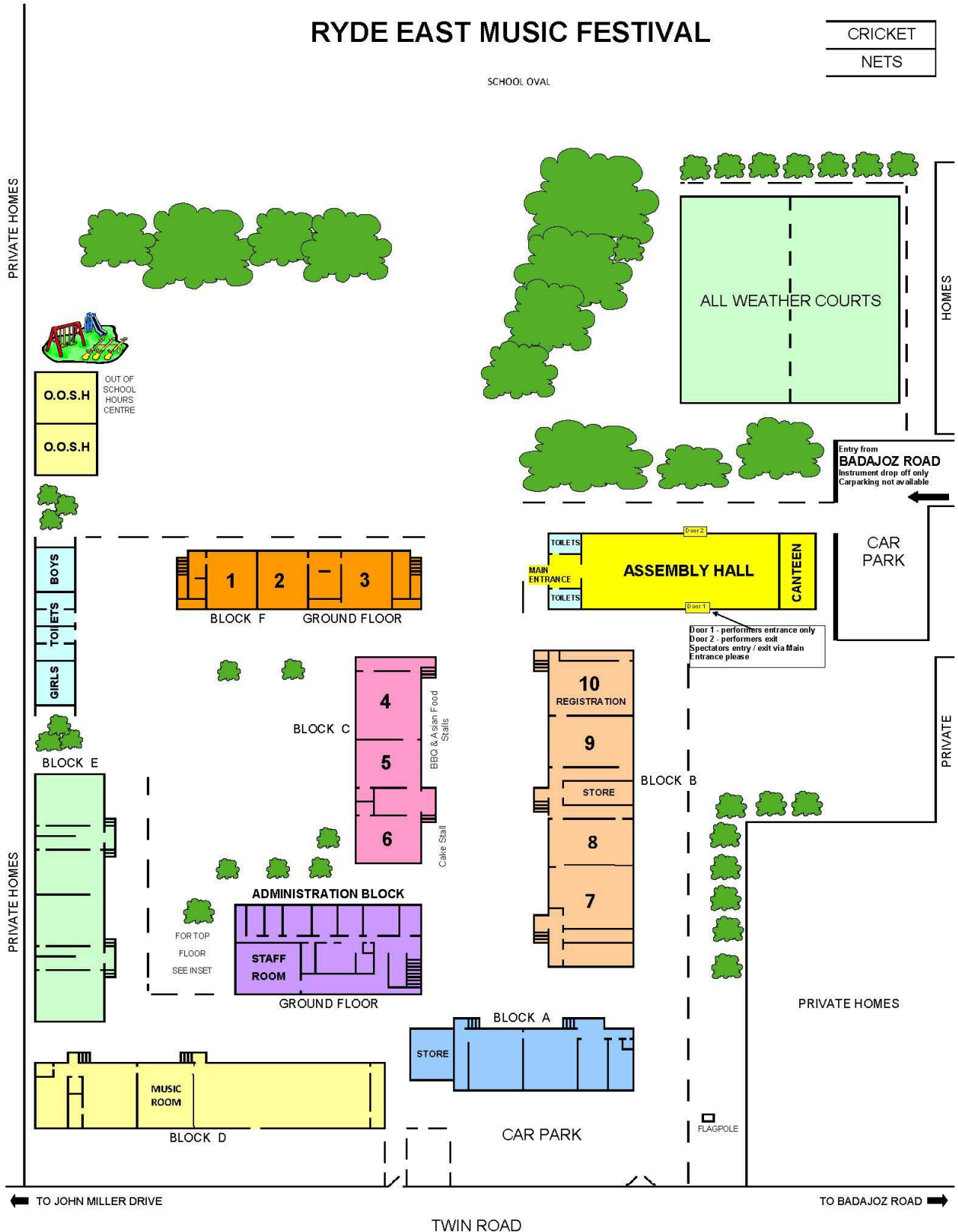

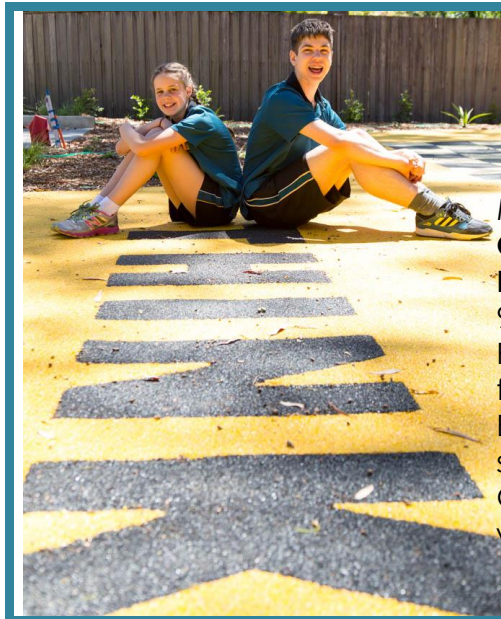
