Principal's Message

Dear Parents and Carers

We had a great start to the week yesterday. The students were so excited to see all their friends and teachers again.

Thank you for your diligence when dropping off and collecting your children. It will be quite busy around the gates until we readjust to the new model at school. Parents remaining off site will be the preferred option for the foreseeable future. Please leave the gateways clear. We had a lot of congestion at bell time yesterday. The Kiss and Drop was very busy with cars parked a long way waiting for their spot. Can I ask that you queue down Nimbrin Street while waiting and be aware of the driveways if people are trying to get into their houses.

It is a really good idea to park and walk if you can while we are discouraged from catching the buses. We understand that there will be a longer wait for some of you. We will of course wait until all children are collected before we leave the gates. A reminder too to be very clear about which gate your child should be waiting. We did have a few confused about where you would be.

Please try to call the Office instead of dropping in unless it is urgent. We have decided for the next few weeks to ask late arrivals to go directly to classrooms. The teacher will keep this record and send to the Office later in the day. We will call you to collect sick children from the Office as needed.

There will be no formal Assemblies this Term but we will be handing out certificates and ribbons outdoors on a Thursday. The teachers have kept many to be distributed this week. Can we also remind you to return any devices you have borrowed as soon as you can.

The Library is operational again but we ask that the children only borrow 1 book per visit at this stage. The books need to be cleaned and left off the shelf for 48 hours before being lent again. It worked quite well yesterday but we will see how it goes with time!

School reports will be issued in a modified format for this Semester. They will be sent to you via an email attachment. We anticipate this will be in Week 10, Friday July 3rd. Teacher interviews can be arranged via a phone call if required in Term 3. We have no information regarding when things may change but will let you know as soon as we do.

The Canteen was operational on Monday and went really well. No over the counter purchases just yet please. Jason at the Uniform Shop is now opening on a Friday afternoon from 1:30pm-3:30pm in the shop. He will continue to complete phone and online orders that are dropped at the Office for collection. Please enter via the driveway gates to collect from outside the Office.

We are still required to keep external providers away from the School. This is the Code Camp, Lego Club, Tiny Tots and Art classes. We will look into re-starting in Term 3 if we have clearance. OT and Speech Therapy have been cleared to recommence.

The Fee Schedule 2020 is ready to be sent to you. We have adjusted Sport, Languages and Computer costs with a 25% reduction as these were not available for many weeks, this schedule will be sent to you this week. Please pay as you are able. As always if you are unable to pay at this time just let me know and we will come to an arrangement.

Parking and road rules in school zones


You need to take extra care when driving and parking in school zones. Make sure that you and your child understand the road rules. If you break the traffic rules in a school zone you are putting not only your child but other children at risk. The parking and traffic rules around our schools are there to protect your children. If you break the rules you will be fined. **Please choose safety over convenience.**

NO STOPPING	You cannot stop in a NO STOPPING zone for any reason (including queuing or waiting for a space).	Keeps clear sight lines between drivers and children / pedestrians.	\$344	(School Zone)		
	You can stop in a NO PARKING zone for a maximum of 2 minutes to drop off and pick up passengers. If no spaces are available you cannot queue on the road way or in any other zones while waiting for a space. You will need to drive away and park elsewhere, only returning when there is space to pull up. You must stay within 3 metres of your vehicle at all times and cannot leave your vehicle unattended.	Provides a safe place for children / pedestrian set down and pick up.	\$191	(School Zone) 2		
BUS	You must not stop or park in a BUS ZONE for any reason (including queuing or waiting for a space) unless you are driving a bus. If times are shown on the sign, you are not allowed to stop during those times.	Provides a safe place for large buses to set down and pick up school children.	\$344 (S)	(School Zone) 2		
	You must not stop on or within 20 metres before a PEDESTRIAN CROSSING or 10 metres after a crossing unless there is a sign permitting parking.	So drivers can clearly see pedestrians on the crossing.	\$457	(School Zone) 2

Demerit Points:

* The **Demerit Points** Scheme is a national program that allocates penalty points (demerits) for a range of driving offences. A driver who has not committed any offences has '**zero**' points. If you commit an offence that carries demerit points, the points are added to your driving record.

KISS AND DROP

In order for Kiss and Drop to operate quickly and effectively it is **VERY IMPORTANT** that the following procedures are observed:

- **DO NOT PARK IN THE KISS AND DROP ZONE** between 2.30 and 4.p.m
- Please STAY IN YOUR CAR.
- Display the surname of the child you are collecting in letters large enough to see from 10 metres. The most effective place to display the name is on the sun visor.
- If your child is not waiting, proceed around the turning circle and rejoin the queue or park in the street. PLEASE DO NOT STOP IN THE TURNING CIRCLE or PARK IN THE NO STOPPING ZONE.
- If the queue extends past the intersection of Satterley Avenue and Nimbrin Street, in fairness to other drivers, please join the queue in Nimbrin St.
- DO NOT QUEUE ONTO THE COMMENARRA this is a NO STOPPING ZONE.
- K-2 students are dismissed at 3.05 p.m. Please be prompt to pick up your children.
- If you have not arrived by 3.20 p.m. students will be supervised in the K-2 Office area.
- Thank you to all the drivers who have their names displayed and who are courteous and considerate at Kiss and Drop.
- Please remember that our Kiss and Drop zone is not a parking area. Please do not leave your car.

NB – Please be aware that the Kiss & Drop area is often visited by Council Rangers/Police Officers to ensure that road rules are being obeyed.
