Environment Team Update



On 19th September, a few members from the environment team – Lexi, Abby, Lia, Will, Kiara, Mayher, Saskia and Angel, with Mrs Neeves and Mrs Prud'Homme – went to the Sustainability Expo at the Sydney Observatory.

Once we arrived, we listened to two schools talk about what they did at school to help the environment. They had clever ideas; one who did a loop composting system, where the community would buy the plants there and give the compost to help regrow plants. The others had a pond/garden where they planted lots of vegetation to help produce oxygen. We were then brought to our first activity.

When we walked in the room, we realised what we were doing beeswax wraps. We sat down on the floor and they explained what we were doing. We chose a coloured piece of material that had different designs on them. Then we cut our material out and brought it to the people that ran the workshop. They ironed our materials so that the bees wax would 'stick' on it.

After that we picked up our materials and stood outside to let it cool down. Then we trimmed it again and it was finished!

After that, a man walked us over to our next workshop where we learned about sea life. We got to make sea animals out of recyclable materials. Then it was finally time for morning tea where we met Mrs Neeves and Mrs Prud'Homme and discussed our morning. After morning tea, the teachers went to their next session and we went to go learn about deforestation. We also made little pot plants to take home.

Then followed lunch. Our next activity was 'Plastic Fantastic?' We discussed what plastic did to our environment. It was actually quite freaky the amount we produce/use. Last but not least, we discovered that bees are vital to us.

The most important part about the expo was the bees. Why you may ask? Because we learnt how important bees were to our environment as they pollinate that helps make new vegetation. A kind lady taught us that Blue Ring Bees (which we didn't know existed) dig burrows in the ground! Here's how you can make a bees nest at home:

- 1. Get some air drying clay.
- 2. Make the bottom flat but the top round.
- 3. Poke holes with a chopstick or a small stick (careful with sticks kids).
- 4. Let it dry for about 4-5 hours.
- 5. Once the nest is dry then face it north-east on the ground.

She had also kindly given the school rosemary and basil which bees love we also made a decomposing plant plot and we planted a plant. At the expo I learned that small things can make a difference. So still wondering how we can help our environment through bees? Well bees need a place to live, so if we make a home for them the bees more bees will come to our house and pollinate more which will make our plants grow quicker.

School Run4Fun Colour Explosion

Students with asthma are advised to be careful in their decision to participate.

Students have now received a Sponsorship Form with instructions on how to raise money and order prizes. Students obtain donations in cash using the Sponsorship Form together with online fundraising.

RE: School Run4 Fun Colour Explosion - Parent Consent

Thank you in advance for supporting the P&C with the School Run4Fun Colour Explosion. The run is just 6 weeks away so we hope your children enjoy this fundraising experience. The run will be held on Thursday 24th October at 2pm.

It is our responsibility to seek permission for your child to participate in the School Run4Fun Colour Explosion. All measures have been taken to ensure that this event is safe for all students.

There will be various colour powder stations throughout the course with two designated lanes – one for colour powder, the other with no powder. Your child can still participate in the event should you not wish for them to be sprayed with colour powder.

The staff will do their best to throw the powder at the torso, however wind and other factors can cause the powder to protrude on the face. Your children will receive some sunglasses that they may wish to wear to protect their eyes.

The colour powder used in the event is non-toxic, biodegradable and environmentally friendly consisting of 98% corn starch and 2% food colouring. It will likely washout of your child's clothing, however we recommend that your child wears a plain white shirt that you don't mind being coloured. That's what the event is all about!

Based on the toxicology profiles of the powders used, their concentrations in the formulation and the mode of use, the colour powder is considered safe for use. Students with lung issues such as asthma are advised to be careful in their decision to participate.

Should you wish to view the ingredient listings and toxicology risk assessment of the powder, please see the staff in the Administration Office.
