



Moolu The Cow

For the past term 6J has been working on a cow named Moolu. Now you may have caught a glimpse of her on your way in and out of computers, but she's much more than just a nice cow.

6J is entering Moolu into a competition called the 'Picasso Cows', which has inspired creativity and learning for almost ten years.

What is Picasso Cows? Well, Picasso Cows is a competition where public schools around NSW compete in painting the best cow. But the free program isn't just about learning how to paint a cow. The program was also made so that students in the city can learn about how milk and dairy farmers work in the country. The winner of the competition will win a huge \$2,500 prize which 6J will donate to the school if they win.

The day Moolu arrived, it was quite a shock for year six to find a life-size white cow standing in the foyer, and nothing to explain what it was doing there! The word had spread like a virus, and soon it seemed the whole year was flocking to the foyer to see the giant white cow. And then the news came that it belonged to 6J. Wow. We were elated—it was ours! Despite the obvious confusion of what a cow was actually doing there and the hilarity of the situation, the main emotion inside most of us was jubilation. There was a cow in the foyer, and it belonged to us!

As we gathered into the classroom buzzing with excitement, we were finally told the purpose of the unexpected bovine: We were going to paint it! Soon after, we all racked our brains for the perfect name. We wanted a pun for the cow's name, which led to some interesting hybrid names like Mairy and of course Moolu, a combination of 'moo' and 'Lulu'. Other names included Clippy, Melk, LuFu, Betty, Cookie and others. After a discussion on the matter of names we voted, and the most popular name was 'Moolu'.

We had tons of fun designing what would go on her before we painted. There were some amazing ideas, but eventually we decided we would have an eco-friendly farm with farmers holding the Earth in their hands. Pencilling the cow was fun too. With a few changes, we took what was on the paper designs and drew them onto the cow. At first, with all the rough pencil lines and the amount of smudging that covered the cow, Moolu didn't look very good at all. In fact, according to some kids, the pencils 'killed her'. But all of that was about to change, because soon, we were going to start the painting!

If the pencils really did kill her, she was certainly revived the moment brush went to canvas. A splash of colour makes all the difference, and as we added details, light and shadow, the cow was really coming together. A lot of changes were made to the original design, and even the first layer of paint. For example, the farmer originally had a moustache and pointed cap, but this was changed to a straw hat and stubble for more of a farmer look, and his wife used to have short brown curls that were changed to the long, silky golden hair she wears today and her red and green jacket was changed to purple.

6J loved this experience, painting Moolu. On behalf of 6J we would like to thank everyone who contributed towards Moolu and especially Mrs James. Another thank on behalf of 6J is Grace, Elyse and Jemima; for taking all their time on Moolu. We have taken this opportunity of a canvas cow and turned it into a masterpiece. Moolu says "thank you for painting me!"

The design of Moolu was:

Both sides of Moolu were going to be two farmers holding the earth. With the sun on the top of the spine and sea birds beside. The head was going to be products being separated into segments.

The modifications on the design were that:

Both sides were different. One side was the two farmers holding the earth and the other side is the farm landscape. The farm landscape is detailed in many ways. All of 6J painted on Moolu and we all had an amazing experience.



School Banking News:

School Banking day is Monday

Remember, Monday is School Banking day and students should bring in their weekly deposit. For every deposit made at school, students will receive a silver Dollarmites token.
